JLD has been busy this League year. On September 23, 160 volunteers joined forces at eight sites around the Denver metro community for our annual L.U.V.S. day of service. The Community Council organized an incredible day filled with outdoor projects, coaching high school students, packaging essential items for new mothers and much more. What a beautiful day to witness women

supporting women through hands-on community work. Our magenta t-shirts were a reminder that girl power is a force that truly makes the world a better place!

The Fundraising Council had a very busy fall! We enjoyed a beautiful dinner at 1908 An Uptown Eatery on September 9. We were thrilled to welcome Chef Beau Green and enjoyed his delicious selections from our newest cookbook, *Centennial Celebrations*. We officially rolled out the 1918 Society to celebrate our recurring donors and honored our biggest supporters at a Major Donor Coffee on October 25. What a delight to see members with decades of history together gather in our new building! Listening to the stories and seeing the smiles demonstrates the significance of League relationships that last a lifetime.

Our 44th Annual Mile High Holiday Mart was a huge success! From our Libations for the League preview party on October 19, to the big shopping weekend, November 10–12, we had a blast welcoming members and the public to DU's campus to raise essential funds for our community work. We hope everyone who attended enjoyed the mix of returning and new vendors and found that perfect gift for everyone on their list. Additionally, we are incredibly grateful to all donors who supported us on Colorado Gives Day, December 5. We had our most successful event this year, raising \$23,663 from 158 donors — wow!

The Junior League of Denver remains a strong presence in Colorado with nearly 1,400 members, including 127 New Members joining our legacy of service. Looking ahead, our members endorsed grant recipients at our February 13 General Meeting. As a result, Growing Home will receive \$5,000 and both Florence Crittenton Services and Gateway Domestic Violence Services will receive \$10,000 grants in the 2024–25 year, in addition to volunteer support. We are grateful to our Advisory Board for leading the charge on developing our new Strategic Plan, which will officially commence in the next League year. I encourage members to attend a Speak-Up to provide input if time allows in March. Our future is bright!



#### Remembering a Colorado Photography Legend

Colorado photographer John Fielder passed away on August 11, 2023, after spending nearly five decades traversing the Centennial State capturing its stunning landscapes. His work became a comprehensive collection of the varied environments of Colorado, which drew people to the state to see the vistas for themselves. He hoped their exposure to the outdoors would instill a sense of respect for nature so that they would become advocates for protecting and preserving what's left of America's wilderness.

Before he passed away, John donated 5,000 of his images to the public through a commemorative exhibit at History Colorado. His hope was to provide a capsule of what Colorado looked like prior to the changing climate. The League also had a connection with John thanks to his donations of photos featured in JLD cookbooks. His breathtaking shots appear in *Créme de Colorado, Colorado Collage*, and *Colorado Classique*. The League is thankful for John's kindness and generosity over the years.

It was a wonderful opportunity to reconnect with fellow Sustainers following the summer break as well as a chance to meet new people while enjoying appetizers, wine and cocktails. There were 80 attendees ranging from new Sustainers to Past Presidents. The event highlighted the life-long friendships created between League members.

#### New Member Class of 1973–74 Celebrates 50th Anniversary

A group of 13 women from the 1973–74 New Member Class gathered on October 20, 2023, at member and Past President Merrilyn Leuthold's home to celebrate 50 years of membership and friendship. Attendees enjoyed catching up on their presentday lives, as well as reflecting on how much JLD has evolved in 50 years. For example, the 1973–74 roster includes 40 women who joined JLD that year; this year we welcomed a class of 127 New Members, showing just how much our League has grown!

An astonishing five Past Presidents came from the 1973–74 class: Bonnie Downing (1981–82), Ellen Fisher (1982–83), Merrilyn Leuthold (1984–85), Arlene Hirshfeld (1986–87) and Carolyn Schafer Wollard (1988–89).

Guests of honor at the anniversary celebration included 1973–74 New Member Chair Day Peters and 1973–74 President Mary Gittings Cronin, who spoke beautifully about JLD history, including recounting what the League was like in the early 1970s and the issues the class was concerned about at the time, including diversity, healthcare, education, and preservation.

Members from the 1973-74 class went on to support a variety of Junior League projects focused on the community's needs, including the following:

• Historical Preservation: Members participated with and donated funds to Historic Denver, Inc., which was initially formed to save the Molly Brown House from demolition.

- **Public Affairs:** The Public Affairs committee was formed in the early 1970s, when the League began exploring our role in policy and advocacy and educating our members on current issues and topics. The Public Policy Council continues to take on that important work today.
- **Establishing Trails:** JLD worked with the Land Use Task Force of the Women's Environmental Coalition to establish the first urban trail way in the State of Colorado. Members also helped establish part of the Hogback trail west of Denver.
- Career Advancement: JLD founded EXPLO Career Education Fair to help high school juniors and seniors plan for a career. The fair hosted 50,000 students over three years, after which the JLD advocated and helped pass a bill requiring career education to become part of all K–12 schooling in Colorado.
- **Healthcare:** JLD collected data and completed/computer-coded over 800 research studies for the HEART (Hereditary Screening, Early Heart Attacks, Atherosclerosis in Childhood, Research Genetics, Teratology) program.

Congratulations to the wonderful women from the 1973–74 New Member class who continue to contribute to the Junior League of Denver in rich and meaningful ways, we appreciate you!
