## JLD PRESIDENT

Dear Community,

What an amazing year our 90th was. We were able to look back at our past, our legacy, while looking forward to our future. In 1918, Helen Daly Peale and 80 of her friends started what has become the Junior League of Denver. From raising money for Belgium Baby Days to creating the concert series at Red Rocks to creating volunteer programs at both the Denver Zoo and the Museum of Natural History (Museum of Nature and Science), the women of the JLD have impacted the community in ways we can not begin to measure.

2008-2009 was the year of the first dispersement from the Foundation to the League, allowing us to impact our community with grants totaling \$90,000 while continuing our work with our community programs. We were able to start a new project, JLD Healthy Habits, taking our experience with Kids in the Kitchen and creating a monthly program for the residents of Joshua Station, exploring topics like fitness, health, food pyramid education, reading a nutritional label, and shopping on a budget. The hard working women of the Done in a Day Committee coordinated over 90 opportunities for members to assist nonprofit organizations around the Metro Denver area.

Senate Bill 09-123, "Healthy Choices Dropout Prevention Pilot Program", was the result of the work of our Public Policy Council, Senator Suzanne Williams, Representative Nancy Todd and our government affairs specialists. This bill creates a pilot out-of-school program to enhance academic achievement and physical and mental health of adolescent students to encourage healthy choices and reduce dropout rates. The program allows at-risk middle schools to apply for and receive funds from grants to use for out-of-school programs that incorporate physical exercise, academic assistance, nutrition counseling, mental health counseling and health education.

After a summer filled with testing, retesting, and testing once again, Colorado Classique was sent to print. This was a labor of love for all of those involved in this multi-year process. This is the fifth of the cookbooks created by the JLD and our JLD Publications Committee worked to continue the sales of all our cookbooks. Our annual fundraisers, Holiday Mart, Partner Projects and "Kitchens that Cook!", although affected by the down turn in the economy, still helped to support our mission. The Second Time Shop exceeded expectations and is continuing to thrive.

As you read through this report, you will find stories about how we make an impact in the community. You will see facts and figures about how many women and children we helped and how much community investment we made. What is harder to capture is the impact on the hearts of the volunteers who make up the Junior League of Denver. At the end of the day, the most precious gift we give to the community is our trained volunteers who believe that we can change the world with the work we do.

# JLD FOUNDATION PRESIDENT

Dear Community,

Perhaps last year might best be summed up by the overused Dickens quotation "it was the best of times, it was the worst of times". On the one hand, we celebrated our 90th Anniversary as we honored the thousands of JLD volunteers and their vision and achievements that have left permanent impressions on the greater Denver area. That vision twenty years ago provided the seeds for the JLD Foundation (JLDF), which has since grown to a point where it provides a meaningful, predictable level of annual funding for our mission and programs. This past year was also one of extreme challenge as we suffered losses in our portfolio from the global economic meltdown. While our investment advisors helped to mitigate the catastrophic losses seen in most portfolios and indices, nevertheless, we will be focused on restoring the asset value as markets recover.

There is no way to thank our donors adequately, for as the economy dealt some difficult blows, our community rose to the occasion with a resounding level of support. Hard times force us to set priorities, and the JLDF became a priority for the largest percentage of our members ever. Our participation levels reached all-time highs as 36% of Actives, 52% of Provisionals and 22% of Sustainers made gifts. Our Helen Daly Peale Society also increased its membership by six women (for a total of 56) who have made planned gifts to the Foundation. We shall continue to encourage a broader annual participation among all of our membership because gifts to the Foundation are a lasting legacy.

This year the Foundation underwrote a celebration of our Emeritus members—those vibrant ladies who have taken their JLD training and experiences and dedicated themselves to a variety of causes to improve the lives of others while they nurtured their friendships and common interests with each other. Each of these 95 women (ages 80 and above) have served as both role model and wise counsel to support and guide our efforts through the decades. The memories shared and relived were inspiring, and while it was obvious that women's lives have changed dramatically, the selfless commitment to voluntarism has not.

The Foundation truly represents the future for the JLD in its ability to provide a predictable and sustained funding source for its mission and programs. The Foundation made its first annual distribution to the JLD in 2008-2009 for its community program and training efforts in the amount of \$216,905 and approved a second annual distribution of \$165,000 for 2009-2010. This tradition will continue annually to augment the JLD's budget, allowing the League to make an impact on the lives of others.

I want to thank the members of the JLDF Board of Directors, our Director of Development Crissie Snow, and each of you who have made the Foundation a philanthropic priority through a shared vision and commitment to our mission and programs. I believe so strongly in the Foundation's capacity to leverage our considerable talent and leadership to allow the JLD to thrive for generations to come. Thank you for the opportunity to serve you and our future volunteers and benefactors.

#### JLD FOUNDATION GOALS

The original goal of the Foundation was to distribute funds annually to the Junior League of Denver (JLD) when the Foundation's corpus reached \$6.6 million. The assets of the Foundation reached that mark on October 31, 2007. Beginning in 2008-2009, the Board of Directors of the Junior League of Denver Foundation approves annual distributions to the JLD. All annual distributions from the Foundation to the JLD are expended as the JLD Board determines, including a designated portion targeted for community programs, per donor intent.



### **JLD FOUNDATION MISSION**

Founded in 1992, the Junior League of Denver Foundation is a 501 (c)(3) not-for-profit corporation and a 509 (a)(3) supporting foundation of The Junior League of Denver, Incorporated (JLD). Its only purpose is to support the purposes and programs of the JLD. Distributions from the Foundation are directed only to the JLD and only at the initiation of the JLD Foundation Board. Funds distributed by the Foundation to the JLD are designated as the JLD Board determines.

The Foundation represents a longterm development strategy to assure the continuing vitality of the JLD in its mission of promoting voluntarism, contributing to the community and training not-for-profit leadership of Denver. The principal of the Foundation increases through gifts from its founder, the JLD, individual donations, bequests and planned gifts, and through investment income. The JLD Foundation's long term development goal is to build the principal so that the Foundation could fund a significant portion of the annual needs of the JLD, including our community programs. A funding partnership between current JLD fundraisers and the long-term development of the Foundation is essential to ensuring the ongoing stability of the JLD.

## COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

#### **COMMUNITY PROGRAMS COUNCIL:**

The Community Programs Council of the Junior League of Denver (JLD) contributes volunteers and dollars to direct service projects, grants, collaborations and training in our focus area of improving the health and education of women and children. In 2008–2009, more than 100 JLD members served in community placements. In celebration of the JLD's 90th Anniversary, the Community Assistance Fund awarded \$90,000 in grants to past community partners and conducted more than 90 Done in a Day events to enable all JLD members the opportunity to contribute to the Denver Metro community.

# COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE FUND COMMITTEE:

Each year that funds are available, the JLD allocates grant dollars to be awarded to non-profit agencies through the Community Assistance Fund (CAF). In 2008-2009, the CAF Committee, chaired by Kim Montgomery, selected grant recipients with an extensive evaluation process that included application review, proposal review, financial review, site visit and interviews. The Women's Foundation of Colorado, SafeHouse Denver and Work Options for Women received grants of \$15,000, \$15,000 and \$10,000, respectively, at the December General Meeting. The following grants were awarded at the May General Meeting: Family Homestead (\$14,000), CASA Advocates for Children (\$13,000), Big Brothers Big Sisters of Colorado (\$10,000), Anchor Center for Blind Children (\$5,000), Kempe Foundation (\$5,000) and Teen with a Dream (\$3,000).

### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH COMMITTEE:**

The Community Outreach Committee provides volunteers and dollars to carry out JLD's outreach efforts in literacy and nutrition. On the first Saturday in March, Community Outreach, chaired by Stephanie Jackson, held the annual Read2Kids literacy project, at four area elementary schools serving more than 600 children and their families. In 2009, the book fair event included story telling

performances by Think 360 Arts to further engage the students' interest in reading. Additionally, the committee conducted three Kids in the Kitchen events at three transitional housing facilities: Decatur Place, Warren Village and Joshua Station. The events taught more than 50 children the importance of nutrition through healthy snack and meal preparation.

#### **DONE IN A DAY COMMITTEE:**

Chaired by Misty Meade, the Done in a Day Committee collaborated with local community organizations to provide volunteers for half-day projects across the Denver Metro Area promoting the Junior League's focus on improving the health and education of women and children. This year, more than 90 Done in a Day events afforded all JLD members the opportunity for hands on community involvement with projects to benefit Denver Children's Advocacy Center, Ronald McDonald House, SafeHouse Denver, Kempe Foundation, Brent's Place and many more.

#### **KIDS CONNECT:**

Since 2000, the JLD has conducted Kids Connect, its award-winning program that encourages parents to read with their children and guides parents in recognizing "teaching moments" in real-life situations. Our volunteers worked with 34 families to incorporate reading with art and music activities in an interactive, play-based environment at two sites in the Metro area: Sheridan Early Childhood Center, chaired by Lauren Andrews and Children's Outreach Project, chaired by Anastasia Glennie. Performances by Think 360 Arts were held again as part of the program in 2008-2009 to bring books to life through interactive performance art activities. The program sites were supported by the Kids Connect Steering and Training Committee, chaired by Jennifer Greer, with 1,200 books, supplies and curriculum for the program.

## **CAREER CONNECTIONS:**

The JLD successfully impacted the lives of single parents through the Career Connections program at Decatur Place. Eight volunteers

worked with the program participants to help them establish attainable career and education goals. The eight-week program, chaired by Linda Osborn, included instruction on a variety of topics such as: goal setting, resume writing, job search strategies, interview skills and appropriate interview attire. The Career Connections program graduated 16 single parents in 2008–2009 with the confidence needed to attain career and life goals.

# PROJECT WISE—WISE WOMEN NETWORK—MENTORING PROJECT:

This placement, chaired by Sabrina Mitchell, enabled JLD volunteers to become mentors in the WISE Women Network (WWN) Mentoring Program which connects lowincome women with community volunteers to establish and work toward personal goals that will lead to personal and economic selfsufficiency. Project WISE curriculum provided the structure to empower mentors to support the participants as they developed life-skills including self-awareness, problem solving, goal setting, effective communications for healthy relationships and financial management. In addition to providing eight volunteers for the program, the JLD provided an \$8,000 grant to support Project WISE.

# JLD HEALTHY HABITS AT JOSHUA STATION:

The JLD Healthy Habits program provided members with the opportunity to develop and implement a much needed nutrition program for women and children living at Joshua Station, a transitional housing facility. Chaired by Lindsay Ehrman, the program helped these families learn healthy nutrition and meal planning. In the fall of 2008, eight committee members met with the residents of Joshua Station to pilot a curriculum comprised of six workshops on topics such as shopping on a budget, healthy meal planning, healthy after school snacks and basic cooking skills. In the spring of 2009, the program was implemented at Joshua Station with much success, serving 12 adults and their children.

## **PUBLIC POLICY**

The Public Policy Council had an exciting 2008–2009. For the second time in JLD history we sponsored our own legislature, SB123. In addition to drafting legislation we supported several bills in line with JLD's mission, worked with community partners on voter registration drives and League wide training opportunities.

Public Policy went to work during the summer months of 2008 with Senator Suzanne Williams, Representative Nancy Todd, and community partners to begin researching for SB123: Healthy Choices Dropout Prevention Bill. Our council worked closely with Senator Williams and Representative Todd to draft legislation that would create a create a pilot out-of-school program to enhance academic achievement and physical and mental health of adolescent students to encourage healthy choices and reduce dropout rates. SB123 would allow at-risk middle schools to apply for and receive funds from grants within the Department of Education to use for out-of-school programs that incorporate physical exercise, academic assistance, nutrition counseling, mental health counseling and health education.

Senator Williams introduced SB123 to the Colorado Legislature in early February 2009 and our council went to work. Our lobbying efforts for SB123 included our council members testimonies in committee hearings, phone calls and emails. We sponsored a breakfast for other non-profits to educate them about SB123 and ask them for their support and vote. We also partnered with the Colorado Non-profit Association and threw a cocktail party for Colorado State Legislators.

In addition to drafting and lobbying our own bill we lobbied for legislation that focused on the health and education of women and children. Our advocacy efforts included testimonies at committee hearings, phone calls and emails to senators and representatives. Three bills that Public Policy supported in the 2009 session were: HB1164: Breast Cancer License Plate/Breast and Cervical Cancer Treatment, HB1243: Increase High School Graduation Rates and SB131: Requires Physical Activity in Public Schools.

We had the privilege to partner with Susan G Komen and Race for the Cure in October 2008 to hold a Voter Registration Drive. With the help of Junior League of Denver (JLD) members we registered over 400 voters. We received recognition from the Rocky Mountain News the following day.

Public Policy held several trainings available to all JLD members throughout the year, including voter registration, Ballot Initiatives with the League of Women's Voters, Cliff Effect Presentations and our Advocacy Camp in conjunction with JLD's Public Affairs Specialist, Aponte and Busam.

We had a diverse group of speakers attend our meetings throughout the year to educate us on different topics. Our guest speakers included pediatrician and obesity specialist, Reggie Washington, M.D., Scott Groginsky from Colorado Children's Campaign, Happy Haynes, from Denver Public Schools, Rep. Dianne Primavera, and Ruth Stemler and Michelle Harden from Operation Frontline Colorado.

The 2008-2009 League year was busy for the Public Policy Council. During the 2009-2010 League year we will be working with the Colorado Department of Education to develop the curriculum for SB123. The Public Policy Council looks forward to working with the Leagues around the state to help with fundraising for SB123 and we hope to implement the first pilot program Fall 2010.

Our council would like to give special thanks to the League for the \$5,000 grant they have committed to giving SB123: Healthy Schools Dropout Prevention Pilot Program.

# JLD FOUNDATION ANNUAL CAMPAIGN

Members of the Junior League of Denver (JLD) and the Junior League of Denver Foundation (Foundation) work together to solicit gifts from JLD members for the Annual Campaign, which is one of the JLD's highest fundraising priorities. All donations to the Annual Campaign are deposited in the Junior League of Denver Foundation, Inc., which is classified by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit corporation and a 509(a)(3) supporting foundation. The sole mission of the Foundation is to support the mission and programs of the Junior League of Denver. Annually, the JLD Board of Directors requests a distribution from the Foundation and determines its use for the following fiscal year.

Gifts to the Annual Campaign increased from 360 JLD members last year to 524 members this year (6/1/08 to 5/31/09). These gifts augment the Foundation's corpus and helped provide sufficient investment income for the Foundation Board members to approve a second annual distribution to the JLD for 2009–2010 of \$165,000. Donations to the Annual Campaign will continue to assure the JLD's volunteer leadership and community support for generations to come.




## **SOURCES OF FUNDS**



Unpaid volunteers have donated a significant number of hours in assisting the League in achieving the goals of its various service programs. The value of this contributed time is not reflected in the accompanying financial statements as it does not meet the requirements of recognition under SFAS No. 116. The League received approximately 62,722 volunteer hours during the fiscal year ended May 31, 2009.

<sup>\*</sup>Note: Based on Mark to Market rule, investment portfolio amounting to \$6.2 million at the beginning of the fiscal year was marked down to \$4.8 million as a consequence of prevailing investment market conditions at the end of the fiscal year. This reflected roughly a 23% decline in the investment value of the portfolio balance during the 12 month period from June 2008 to May 2009.

## **FUNDRAISING**



#### **HOLIDAY MART**

The Holiday Mart, introduced in 1979, has grown into a major shopping event featuring thousands of unique gift items offered by retailers and artisans from Colorado and throughout the country. In addition to shopping, special events, entertainment, and children's attractions add to the excitement. The December 2008 and October 2009 Holiday Marts netted \$101,000 and \$131,000 respectively.

#### **BRIDGE MARATHON**

From September through May, the Bridge Marathon involves both League members and others in the community who play bridge on a regular basis.

#### KITCHENS THAT COOK!

Much like popular home tours around the country, the JLD's "Kitchens that Cook!" kitchen tour introduces designers and displays kitchens as a self-guided tour to thousands of event attendees each spring. This fundraising event started in 2004 as a pilot project and has been evolving from year to year. The 2008 and 2009 "Kitchens That Cook!" events netted \$38,000 and \$15,000 respectively.

#### **PARTNER PROJECTS**

Partner Projects researches and evaluates a variety of partnership opportunities throughout the League year for viability, outreach, and return on investment. The type and frequency of Partner Project opportunities changes from year to year.

## **SECOND TIME SHOP**

The Second Time Shop is an upscale resale boutique providing customers with a superb selection of new and gently used merchandise including men's, women's, and children's clothing, accessories, and home decor. STS is directly supported by the generous donations from membership and the community. The Second Time Shop netted \$50,000 in 2008 and \$61,000 in 2009.

#### JLD PUBLICATIONS

JLD Publications started 30 years ago with Colorado Cache, and was followed by Creme de Colorado, Colorado Collage, and Colorado Colore. Colorado Classique was released in June 2009. In the last 30 years, close to 2 million copies have been sold. In 2008 and 2009, JLD Publications netted \$51,000 and \$37,000 respectively.

#### **Our Cookbooks:**

Colorado Colore, A Palate of Tastes, \$29.95—A selection of more than 300 recipes that includes richly-hued visual presentations and many recipes with fresh vegetables.

Colorado Collage, \$27.95—A collection of more than 500 recipes that highlights delicacies from fresh rainbow trout to fruits grown in the orchards of the Western Slope.

Crème de Colorado Cookbook, \$24.95—Has 700 recipes with 15 sections of mouth watering recipes ranging from wild duck gumbo to chicken fajitas.

Colorado Cache Cookbook, \$19.95—Includes 700 recipes that reflect our state's casual style of living, rich heritage and natural bounty. Has sold more than one million copies.

Colorado Classique— Released June 25, 2009

\$29.95—The newest JLD cookbook includes recipes emphasizing fresh ingredients, nature photography by John Fielder, and is a Forest Stewardship Council certified environmentally conscious book.

#### JLD FOUNDATION HISTORY

In the late 1980s, the JLD researched ways of creating a secure funding base for its ongoing financial stability. An endowment fund was established by the JLD Board with \$70,000 at our 70th Anniversary. The endowment fund grew primarily from excess fundraising income and reached its \$1M goal in 1992. An Annual Campaign to solicit the membership for gifts was established in 1990 and continues today to solicit on behalf of the Foundation. In 1991, a special committee of the JLD recommended the establishment of a supporting foundation to better meet the long-term needs of the JLD. The \$1M endowment fund served as seed money for the new JLD Foundation which became incorporated by the state of Colorado in 1992. A Board, currently of thirteen, governs the Foundation independently from the JLD and its Board.
