### **JLD MISSION**

The Junior League of Denver, Inc. (founded in 1918) is an organization of women committed to promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women and improving the community through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers. Our purpose is exclusively educational and charitable.

### **JLD FOCUS**

Improving the community through the health and education of women and children.

### **JLD TRAINING**

Recognized as Metro Denver's leading women's organization, the Junior League of Denver develops leaders who positively impact our community. This year, our Leadership Training Institute launched its new year-long training program. The inaugural Leadership Development Institute (LDI) class received formal, professional-quality training in areas of leadership, strategic thinking and planning, non-profit management, and conflict resolution, to name a few topics. The goal of the program is to give women the tools and leadership savvy to serve the Denver metro community and positively impact the world around them.

## **DEAR COMMUNITY AND MEMBERS,**

About four years ago, a small group of members and staff sat down together in a room at Junior League of Denver (JLD) Headquarters and brainstormed ways to collectively articulate their individual experiences in the League. The purpose was to craft an internal message that would help define what it means to be a member of this organization. As a result, we created an impactful message that all members can use to describe the League: Live the Legacy — Give, Grow, Get Connected.

Everyone in the room had similar yet unique experiences. Despite the fact that each experience was slightly different from the next, they all expressed the same theme — a deep appreciation for the opportunity to connect with inspiring women and a sense of legacy. We intuitively understood the power of the JLD and its legacy.

During the 2010-2011 JLD year, a lot of time was spent researching and discussing the League's focus and overall impact in the Denver community. Although it is still a work in progress, we believe that the JLD is the premier organization in the Denver community for developing women as civic and community leaders. That's our legacy. It is evident that the many Sustainers and Actives who are engaged in great ways to improve our community were able to do so through skills and relationships they developed in the JLD. You will see our legacy in key areas of public policy as well as in familiar organizations like The Children's Hospital, The Children's Museum, Craig Rehabilitation Center, Girls Incorporated of Metro Denver, Ronald McDonald House, Warren Village and the Women's Foundation — just to name a few.

Our legacy is also manifested in the Junior League of Denver Foundation (JLD Foundation). Through the creation of the JLD Foundation, bold and insightful women identified a need in our community (the sustainability of the JLD and our ability to impact the Denver community), developed a solution for that need in the JLD Foundation and implemented a strategy for success. Supporting the JLD Foundation supports our legacy.

The long-term development goal for the JLD Foundation is the future funding of the JLD. The plan is to increase the JLD Foundation's assets to the extent that the JLD Foundation, could, if necessary, fund the JLD's annual needs.

We aren't there yet, but thanks to the generosity of a very special anonymous donor, who contributed a \$50,000 challenge grant to the JLD Foundation (called the Power of Participation campaign) to match the new and increased gifts from the JLD donors to the JLD Foundation, we had our best fundraising year ever.

In these difficult economic times, the members of the JLD Board of Directors and the JLD Foundation Board of Directors are working hand in hand to secure gifts for the JLD Foundation to ensure the legacy of the JLD.

Thank you to all who have so generously supported both the JLD and the JLD Foundation with your time, talent and donations.

# JLD FOUNDATION

## DONOR RECOGNITION

Our donations this year totaled \$202,528. Thanks to the generosity of Actives, Provisionals, and Sustainers we had 220 new or increased gifts totaling over \$31,279 and 80 major gift donors who contributed \$500 or above resulting in gifts of \$147,324. Overall, 380 members contributed to the Annual Campaign.

Thank you to Cydney Marsico who hosted the Annual Fall Recognition event for donors of \$500 and above as well as members of the Helen Daly Peale Society, our planned giving society, at her beautiful home and to her co-chairs: Jan Meyer, Sue Anschutz-Rodgers and Nancy Petry.

Additionally, 61 Sustainer Emeritus members (JLD members age 80 and above) attended our annual Sustainer Emeritus Spring Luncheon. We thank co-chairs Lucile Trueblood, Eileen Honnen, and Joan Smith, and honorary co-chairs Gene Koelbel, Frankey Latcham and Nancy Petry.

These two events underscore the long-term impact JLD members and former members have had and continue to have on the community. The philanthropic leadership and community involvement of these women is truly awe-inspiring.

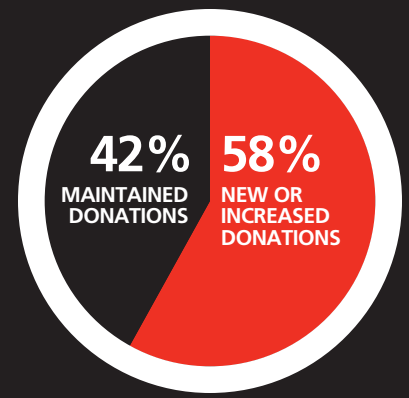
## GOALS

The goal of the JLD Foundation is to distribute unrestricted grants annually to the JLD. All annual distributions from the JLD Foundation's Board of Directors to the JLD are expended as the JLD Board determines, including a designated portion targeted for community programs, per donor intent. **The long-term goal is to reach \$10 million in invested funds by the JLD's 100th anniversary in 2018.**

## MISSION

Founded in 1992, the Junior League of Denver Foundation is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit corporation and a 509(a)(3) supporting foundation of The Junior League of Denver, Inc. Its sole purpose is to secure the financial vitality of the JLD in perpetuity.

The members of the JLD Foundation's Board of Directors and their respective committees solicit gifts from JLD members to increase the principal of the investment portfolio. The principal increases through gifts from JLD members and selected community members, bequests and planned gifts, and investment income. The portfolio is managed by Innovest Portfolio Solutions, Inc., reporting to the JLD Foundation's Investment Committee.



## POWER OF PARTICIPATION: 2010-11 JLD ANNUAL CAMPAIGN

In response to a very special anonymous donor's challenge to the JLD membership for new/increased gifts, JLD members responded in record numbers. The gifts of 220 members who gave new/increased gifts between October 1, 2010 and May 31, 2011 as compared to fiscal year 2009-2010 totaled \$41,278.96.

The challenge continues until the entire match of \$50,000 is raised.

# COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

The Junior League of Denver provides funds, volunteers and facilitation assistance through JLD programs and “Done in a Day” (DIAD) projects at various nonprofit agencies throughout the Denver metro community. The main focus area of the JLD Community Programs is to improve the health and education of women and children.

## 2010–11 COMMUNITY PROGRAMS:

- **Career Connections & Empowerment at Decatur Place:** Empowering parents to reach their professional potential.
- **Community Assessment Research and Enrichment (CARE):** CARE works with the Community Research & Development Committee to shape a complete community program that focuses on the health and education of women and children.
- **Community Assistance Fund (CAF):** Grants for local nonprofit organizations that improve the health and education of women and children.
- **Done in a Day:** Providing volunteers and making a difference for organizations across the Denver metro area.
- **JLD Healthy Habits at Joshua Station:** Making healthy nutrition habits enjoyable, interactive and easy for families.
- **Kids Connect:** Our signature program—educating and nurturing families with children through literacy.
- **Kids in the Kitchen:** Fighting childhood obesity by promoting healthy eating habits and lifestyles.
- **Kids on the Block:** Teaching children to make healthy choices through puppetry and skits.
- **Read2Kids:** Promoting literacy through parental and caregiver involvement.

## NEW 2010–11 COMMUNITY PARTNER: THE GATHERING PLACE



### The Gathering Place *a refuge for rebuilding lives*

The Gathering Place is Denver’s only daytime, drop-in center for women and their children who are experiencing homelessness and poverty. The Gathering Place exists to support these women and children by providing a safe daytime refuge and resources for self-sufficiency. Here they have access to emergency survival services such as meals, bathing facilities, telephones, and on-site child care. The goals of The Gathering Place fall in line well with the mission of the JLD, creating a mutually beneficial community partnership.

During the 2010–11 year, we touched the lives of approximately 250 women and children by providing two meals monthly: a snack and a lunch. We packed 25 food boxes each week so families would have food over the weekend. We also expanded the food supply in Betsy’s Cupboard, the pantry at The Gathering Place, through committee member donations.

As we look ahead to the new League year, we will expand our outreach with The Gathering Place thanks to the generous support of the JLD Foundation and Board of Directors. By doubling our committee size from seven to 15 members, we look forward to providing further support to this wonderful community institution. We plan to serve four meals monthly, support the Card Project by selling greeting cards made by The Gathering Place clients, lead food drives for Betsy’s Cupboard and volunteer each Wednesday morning in Betsy’s Cupboard. With this increased outreach, we anticipate our volunteers will impact the lives of over 500 women and children each month in 2011–12. This is possible due to the financial contributions so generously given to the JLD Foundation by our members in 2010–11.

# PUBLIC POLICY

## 2010–11 LEGISLATIVE SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

- Successful 2010 candidate forum held at our annual Holiday Mart
- Record number of Legislators at annual legislative event
- JLD press kits distributed to the General Assembly
- Six JLD supported bills signed into law

During the 2011 session, the JLD tracked 14 bills and resolutions, actively supporting six and opposing one. The focus remains squarely on the League’s mission to enhance the community through the health and education of women and children.

A summary of the JLD’s key bills is below:

In addition to the bills listed above, the League monitored legislation dealing with bullying in schools, mandatory reporting of abuse and neglect, teen pregnancy and dropout programs, as well as other issues pertaining to the JLD’s focus.

## UPDATE ON SB 09-123 IMPLEMENTATION

As part of the JLD’s long-term investment in SB 09-123, members met with policy staff from the Lt. Governor’s office to discuss the implementation process. As the funding line item was removed from the Department of Education’s budget during the 2011–12 fiscal year budget process, movement of the program to the JLD for implementation is imminent. Thanks to the hard work and fundraising efforts of the 2010–11 Public Policy Council, the League is now working for implementation in the 2013 school year. Follow up with the Lt. Governor’s Office is required, and League members can expect to work on this issue over the summer months.

### GIFT OF TIME

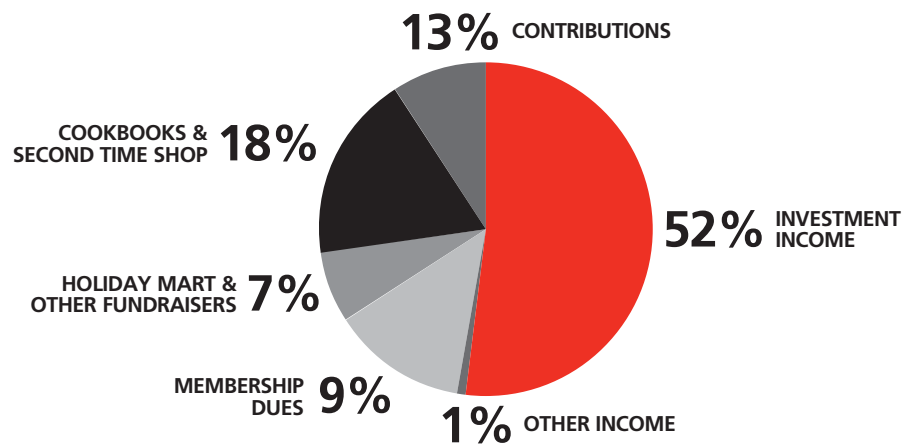

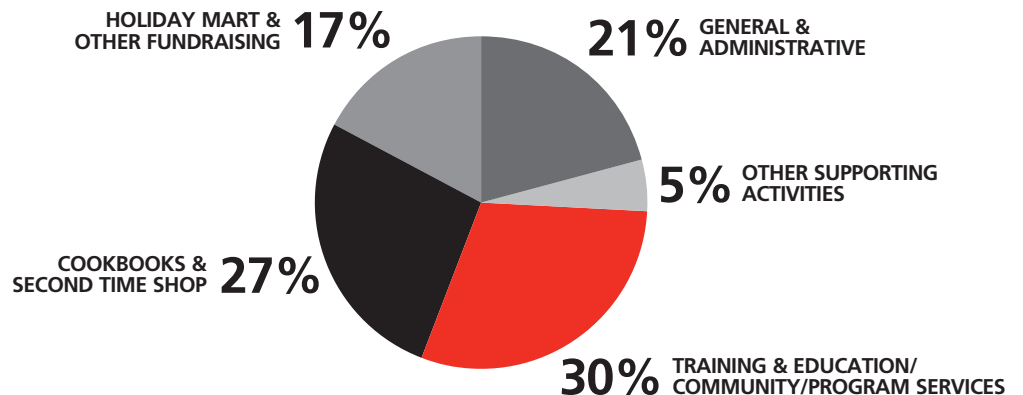

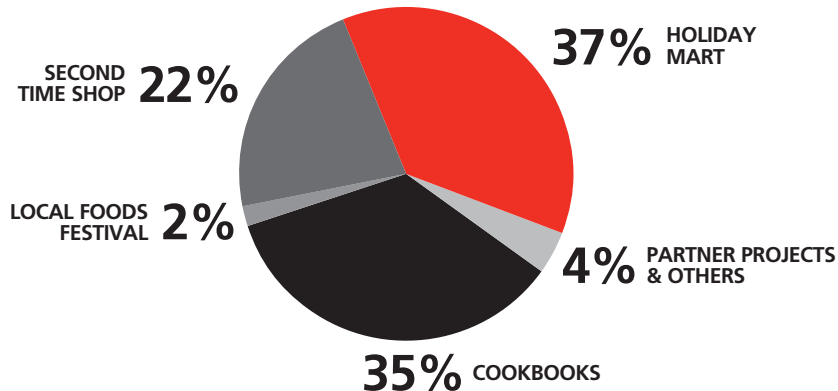

## LOCAL FOODS FESTIVAL: SEPTEMBER 11-12, 2010

2010 marked the inaugural year of the Local Foods Festival, the JLD's newest fundraising event. We partnered with the Denver Botanic Gardens to host this weekend long fundraiser that consisted of a two-day farmer's market, two educational events; a salsa and guacamole workshop presented by Chipotle Mexican Grill and learning to pot container plants and herbs that can be used in cooking by Roger Burleigh, a social event called Rhinestone Rodeo for League members and their friends and a chili cook-off competition. Congratulations to Craig Lean, the 2010 winner of the Local Foods Festival Chili Cook-Off!

This event was created to replace the "Kitchens That Cook!" tour with a new fundraiser that embodies similar themes and raises awareness of healthy living in a family-friendly setting. By leveraging the attendance to the Denver Botanic Gardens annual Corn Maze, we had over 4,000 people visit the Local Foods Festival.

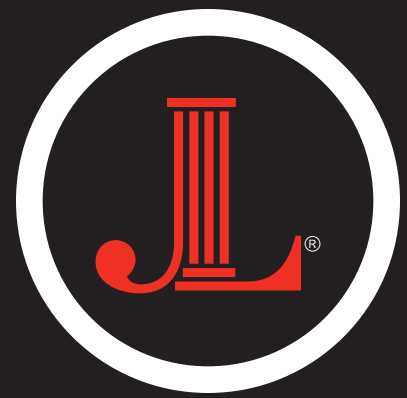
