Reflecting on the 2016–2017 Year and Looking to our Future

The work of the Junior League of Denver is tireless. During our 99year history, the League has started more than 100 different programs, often taking on challenges in the Denver community no one else desired to in the areas of education, health, and children. Even as the role of women in society and the work place have historically changed, the JLD continues to take on impactful work and improve the landscape of the Denver community.

The League's **Read2Kids** and **Kids Connect** programs place books in the hands of children and provide an environment where families enjoy interactive activities that encourage reading together. I'm proud to say that this year, the JLD devoted about 6,000 community volunteer hours, served more than 3,800 meals, and distributed about 3,600 books to families in an effort to educate parents about the importance of reading to their children early, and to help improve literacy rates for school age children.

On September 23, 2017, we will host our inaugural JLD L.U.V.S. event, a League-wide service day (Leaders United in Volunteer Service). I encourage you to read more about L.U.V.S. in this issue of *ink*. This new community program is an impactful way to orchestrate meaningful change in the Denver community.

We are defined by the strength of our members, and are catalysts for lasting community change. J.M. In celebration of the tireless efforts our advocates make for Colorado's women and children, our Public Policy Council awards an individual whose dedication to public service and outstanding commitment renders paramount. This award is a token of gratitude and recognition of the hard work and support the legislative community has demonstrated in the advancement of the League's mission.

The Junior League of Denver Public Policy Council is proud to honor **Senator Beth Martinez Humenik** (R-Thornton) as the 2017 Legislator of the Year. Sen. Martinez Humenik is in her first term representing the citizens of Senate District 24, including Adams County.

During her time in the Legislature, Sen. Martinez Humenik has been a champion for children, sponsoring several bills to promote educational opportunities and quality early childhood education. She previously chaired the Early Childhood and School Readiness Commission and was instrumental in passing House Bill 17-1106, continuing the state's Early Childhood Leadership Commission. This past February, Sen. Martinez Humenik hosted the Public Policy Council for a Legislative Breakfast, where members met with state senators and representatives to discuss the League's policy priorities.

"It was an honor and a privilege to partner with Senator Martinez Humenik this legislative season on a number of issues that directly impact Colorado's children and the education they receive," says **Jenn Stickel**, Public Policy Council VP. "As a council, we are proud to honor her, especially knowing that her passion for Colorado's children makes her a fierce advocate and voice for the League's mission in the Senate."

SPARKLING SANGRÍA

Serves: 6-8 portions Prep: less than 30 minutes Fill a large pitcher halfway with ice. Add wine, rum, soda, and lime and orange slices; stir. Pour mixture into glasses and garnish with strawberries, peaches, and baby Key limes.

- 1 750 ml bottle Pinot Grigio wine
- 1⁄4 cup white rum
- 24 ounces diet lemon-lime soda
- 2 peaches, sliced
- 2 limes, sliced into ¼ inch thick rounds
- 1 orange, sliced into ¼ inch thick rounds
- 1 pint fresh strawberries, halved, or quartered if large
- 2 baby Key limes, sliced into rounds
